#### **Before your delivery**

As an expectant parent, you already know there's much to be done before the arrival of your baby. We're pleased and honored to offer a variety of services to help make these coming months as stress-free and productive as possible. Take a look at what you can expect from us, as well as some tips on how to prepare for your big moment.

#### **Enroll in parent education classes**

Whether you are expecting your first child or are already a parent, we offer a variety of classes to fit every family. The classes cover topics such as childbirth, breastfeeding and newborn care in a classroom setting. Please refer to the Parent Education class schedule on our website for details on available classes.

#### **Tour Women's Services**

#### Make admission arrangements

We encourage you to pre-register by the fourth month of your pregnancy so that we may begin processing your admission paperwork before your delivery. To complete your admission online, visit BSWHealth.com/YourMomentCentennial and scroll down to the Pre-register online now section. Once you are done, you'll receive an email confirmation of your submission. If you have an out-of-pocket responsibility, you will receive a letter confirming your benefits and an estimate of what you will owe.

#### Select a pediatrician

Prior to delivery, it is important that you select a pediatrician or family medicine doctor to see your baby. Your baby will need to be seen by his or her physician 48 hours after being sent home from the hospital. Speak with your obstetrician, call **1.844.BSW.DOCS** or visit our website at BSWHealth.com for information regarding your choice of physician.

#### **Antepartum testing**

To evaluate mom's and baby's well-being, we have a dedicated center for antepartum (during pregnancy) testing. Specialized procedures include amniocentesis, ultrasound, non-stress testing and biophysical profiles.

### What to bring for mom

Items that you may want to bring include:

- Your driver's license, insurance card and list of medications
- Loose-fitting casual wear, nursing gown, bras and other breastfeeding-related clothing
- Underwear
- Toiletries (shampoo, toothpaste, etc.)
- Robe
- Slippers or loose-fitting shoes
- Camera
- Cellphone charger
- Breastfeeding pillow
- Breast pump

# What to bring for baby

While your baby is in the hospital, we will provide diapers, wipes, a T-shirt and a hat. Items that you may want to bring include:

- Special clothing for baby's first picture
- Socks or booties
- Receiving blanket or cover blanket for your trip home
- Clothing to wear home
- Car seat that is weight and age appropriate for baby and not expired
- Pediatrician's name and contact information

# We recommend that you have a certified car seat technician help you install your car seat before you deliver. Email **CentWomens@BSWHealth.org** to make an appointment.

#### Photography and videotaping

Video and still photography will be limited to pre-delivery and will be allowed after your baby's birth at the discretion of the hospital staff.



Women's Services is located on the second floor. Please utilize the intercom for entrance. After 9:00 PM, enter through the Emergency Department. The doors are locked at this time for security purposes.



Enjoy the family-focused atmosphere provided in our beautifully decorated, private suites. You can plan on laboring, delivering and recovering all in the same room. If you have a planned or unplanned cesarean section, the operating suites and recovery are located conveniently on the second floor. There is plenty of room for your partner or another family member to spend the night.

#### Labor and Delivery

The birth of your child is one of life's biggest moments, and it is our privilege to support you every step of the way. From advanced technology and comfortable Labor and Delivery rooms to understanding the needs of family and friends, we're focused on making sure your delivery is as smooth and comfortable as possible.

# **Dedicated Antepartum Unit**

The Antepartum Unit is for expectant women with high-risk pregnancies. Women who are admitted to the unit are considered at risk for pregnancy-related complications and require hospitalization prior to delivery.

# Visitors during labor

Family members are welcome. For the safety and privacy of our patients, we ask that you keep the hallways clear.

#### Security

We have several security measures in place to protect you and your baby. Our staff will review these measures with you upon admission.



#### After delivery

The first few days after the birth of your baby, known as postpartum, are so important. With our family-focused care philosophy, we customize care based on your needs. Fathers or partners are an important part of this experience and are encouraged to stay the night with mom and baby in our New Family Center.

#### Time with baby (rooming-in)

After birth, you and your baby will be welcomed to our New Family Center. In this unit, you will receive care together unless additional care is needed. (We also refer to this as rooming-in.) We believe this time immediately after birth, while your baby is alert, is important. We encourage breastfeeding and skin-to-skin contact immediately after birth and throughout your stay. Your nurse will be available to assist you and the needs of your new baby.

#### **Neonatal Intensive Care Unit**

Our NICU is a Level II unit that provides advanced life-support services and technologies for premature and seriously ill newborns. Staffed by specialized nurses, neonatal nurse practitioners, neonatologists and many other skilled staff, the unit is designed to promote optimal developmental care for special infants. Parents are encouraged to be actively involved in the care of their babies while in the NICU.



#### **Breastfeeding**

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months of your baby's life and breastfeeding with complementary foods for the first two years and beyond as mutually desired. Our New Family Center nurses have special training and are available to assist you in a positive breastfeeding experience. Lactation consultants are also part of the staff and are here to help you. To register for a breastfeeding class, please email **CentWomens@BSWHealth.org**.

#### Special tests for your newborn

Texas requires that your newborn be tested for metabolic disorders. These tests are performed when your baby is 24 – 36 hours old. The tests require a small blood sample that is collected through a heel stick. In addition, your baby will receive a pain-free hearing test and heart health screening. It is important that we have an accurate phone number for you so that we may reach you if there are any abnormal results. To find out more about these tests, please ask your nurse or call **1.844.BSW.DOCS**.

Should your baby weigh less than 5 pounds or be younger than 37 weeks, a car seat test will be needed upon discharge. We offer free car seat inspections on-site to ensure your car seat is properly installed before you deliver. To schedule your free appointment, email CentWomens@BSWHealth.org.
